



Natural Gas and Oil

Fuels Michigan's Economy and Workforce:

The U.S. natural gas and oil industry will be a key driver of the post-pandemic recovery in Michigan. The industry directly and indirectly supported over 250,000 Michigan jobs, provided over \$15.8 billion in wages and contributed more than \$28.4 billion to the state's economy in 2019, according to a study conducted by PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) that compiles the latest available government data.



JOBS OVERVIEW

From pipeline operators and refinery workers to truck drivers and manufacturers, the natural gas and oil industry supports a wide range of jobs across the Michigan economy. Research shows that every direct job in the natural gas and oil industry supports an additional 4.1 jobs in Michigan.

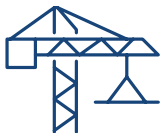
